Our Travellers

Our travellers share a sense of adventure and a desire to experience the scenery and culture of the Australian outback without leaving a footprint. They come from all over the world and include single travellers, families, honeymooners and empty nesters.

Our Vehicles

Adventure Tours are operated in a fleet of comfortable 2WD trucks, while our Kimberley Wild Expeditions are operated in our fleet of custom-built high clearance 4WD vehicles. All vehicles have comfortable, forward-facing seats, standing room in-vehicle, large viewing windows, air conditioning with personal air vents and walk-in storage (no risky trailers!).

Our Guides

With extensive experience in the Australian outback, our guides are professional experts in local culture, history and environment. They hold current First Aid Certificates and are endorsed by the Australian government, so you have a safe, enjoyable adventure. On some of

our itineraries, guides are accompanied by a tour assistant to provide additional support, both to our guide and our travellers. In addition, we also enjoy the expertise and insight of local indigenous guides in key locations throughout the Kimberley – adding a valuable cultural perspective to your outback adventure.

Our Accommodation

The style and standard of accommodation varies throughout our itineraries, ranging from outback station stays and 'billion star' camping to private wilderness camps and safari tents. On our Kimberley Expeditions, we offer the choice of comfortable Camping or Camping Plus, on which we assist you to make the most of basic upgrades where available.

Fitness

Wild Expeditions are for reasonably fit and mobile travellers – age is irrelevant. Itineraries often involve some very early starts and long days. We are exploring a range of remote wilderness environments and activities may involve some clambering over rocks, wading in water by torchlight, walking on rocky creek beds and ascending/descending into gorges. A reasonable level of fitness and being sure on your feet is necessary to fully participate. Please refer to the **Fitness** level (explained below) for each itinerary and discuss any concerns with our office prior to booking.

Easy: You need to be able to get in and out of the high clearance 4WD vehicles, but there is limited physical activity on the itinerary – walks are generally short and on flat terrain.

Moderate: There will be a few longer walks on flat or uneven terrain. The walks could involve rough patches where you are required to clamber over rocks or up and down wilderness tracks.

Advanced: No need to be a mountaineer, but some walks are reasonably challenging: on uneven terrain, sometimes unstable underfoot, and including steep (but usually short) descents and ascents into gorges. It is possible to opt out of the more difficult walks, so those with Moderate fitness may still be able to choose one of these trips – feel free to discuss options with our office.

Days 1-2 Pinnacles Desert & Kalbarri National Park

Explore the amazing formations of the Pinnacles Desert, visit the Lobster Shack and spend a day in Kalbarri National Park, including a walk to Nature's Window and Z-Bend Gorge. (BLD/BLD)

Days 3-4 Shark Bay World Heritage Area In the Shark Bay World Heritage area we visit Shell Beach, take a guided tour of the Ocean Park Aquarium, discover the ancient stromatolites of Hamelin Pool and greet the world famous Monkey Mia dolphins. (BLD/BLD)

Days 5-7 Coral Bay & Exmouth Three nights at our private camp on Yardie Creek Station allows time to explore the underwater world of Ningaloo Reef, off Turquoise Bay and Coral Bay. Days 8-10 Karijini National Park In the heart of the Pilbara we discover Karijini National Park. Formed over 2,500 million years ago, the Hamersley Ranges are some of the most unusual landforms on earth, including Dales Gorge, Fortesque Falls, Fern Pool, Circular Pool, Weano Gorge and Hancock Gorge. Trekking into these gorges you'll come across cascading waterfalls and fresh, still waterholes that are ideal for swimming. (BLD/BLD/BL)

Day 11 The Pilbara Return to the coast and the iron ore town of Port Hedland. After lunch we continue on through the Pilbara, where we spend the final night together on an overnight station stay. (BLD)

Day 12 Eighty Mile Beach & Broome On our last day we stop in for a stroll on Eighty Mile Beach before arriving in sunny tropical Broome! An afternoon tour will introduce you to this remarkable outback town, culminating in sunset on Cable Beach. (BL)

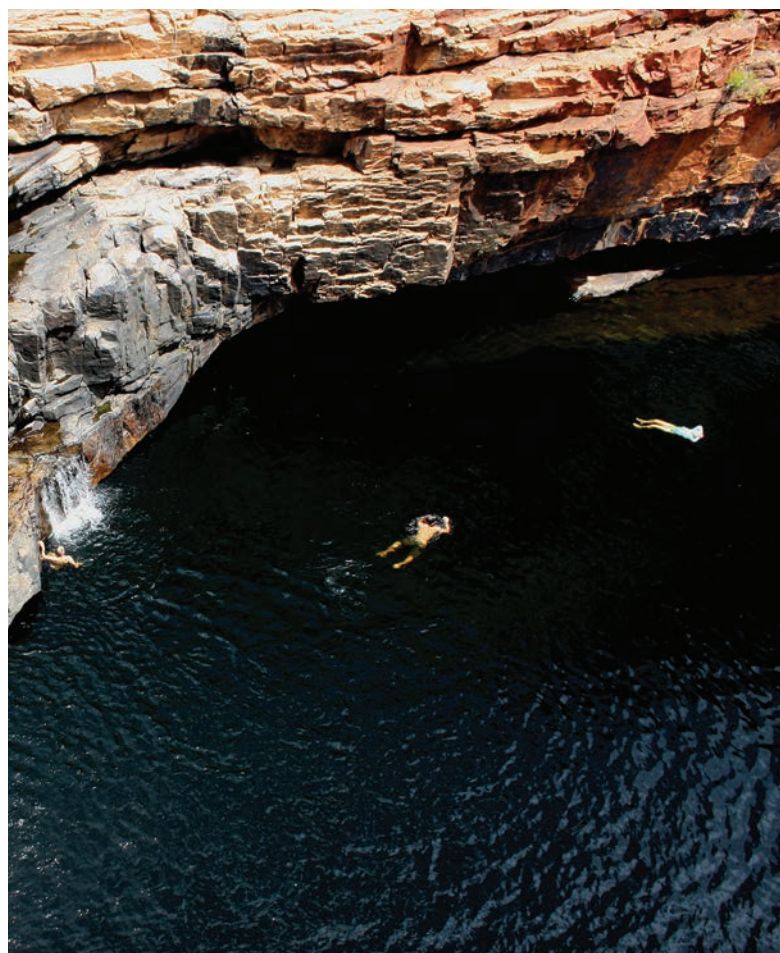

OUR CONTRACT All bookings are made with Kimberley Wild Expeditions Pty Ltd (trading as Kakadu Wild Expeditions, Western Wild Expeditions and Wild Expeditions). By booking a trip with us you are deemed to have agreed to these Booking Conditions (which constitutes the entire agreement between you and us) and your booking will be accepted by us on this basis.

VALIDITY This brochure is valid from 1 April 2017 to 31 March 2018.

PRICES All prices are inclusive of 10% GST and are valid from 1 April 2017 to 31 March 2018. Kimberley Wild reserves the right to alter these prices in the event of any unforeseen circumstances. Where applicable, child prices apply to children 4 to 12 years old. On Day Tours concession rates apply to YHA Members and those holding valid Australian Pension, Seniors and Student Cards.

Prices

Tour prices in this brochure are per person and in Australian Dollars. Prices for tours with accommodation, are quoted on a twinshare basis. Single supplements will apply to upgrades.

Departure

Most of our Extended Tours are Guaranteed with only 2 travellers so look out for the Departure Guaranteed tick! Other tours depart subject to a minimum 6 travellers.

Medical Form

Due to the remote location and challenging nature of our Extended Tours it is essential for our travellers who are 70 years and beyond, to review and sign a Medical Form to ensure you can participate fully in the itinerary and will enjoy your adventure.

Participation

On those nights where we are not staying in one of our private permanent camp sites, it is important that travellers participate in setting up camp and preparing/clearing meals, though the Tour Guide and (where applicable on selected Kimberley Expeditions) the Tour Assistant, will also be on hand to help – it is a team effort! It is essential that all our groups leave the camps they stay in as they found them for the next travellers – these parts of Western Australia are pristine and it is our responsibility to ensure it stays this way.

Hotel Pick Up & Departure Points

We offer a FREE Hotel Pick Up from key hotels in the Perth & Darwin CBD's and all key hotels and regular bed and breakfasts in Broome. Our friendly reservations staff will advise you of the time on booking. It is also important that you call our office and reconfirm the day prior to departure. Please be patient if we are a little late but call 1300 73 88 70 if you are concerned that you have missed your pick up.

Protect the Environment

The outback is pristine and we are dedicated to preserving its fragile environment. We ask travellers to bring a long sleeve shirt and broad-brimmed hat to reduce the need for sunscreen and insect repellent, which leak into waterways when showering and swimming.

Climate

Australia's north has a Wet Season (Nov to Mar) and a Dry Season (Apr to Oct). During 'the Wet' many 4WD roads and National Parks are closed, which limits where you are able to go in the north. Kimberley tours only operate during 'the Dry', when it can get surprisingly cold overnight – in Broome it can cool down to 12°C, while in the Bungle Bungles, it can fall as low as 5°C!

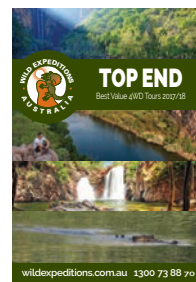
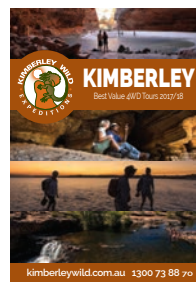
- ☐ A broad-brimmed sun hat & sunscreen

- ☐ Personal water bottle (1.5L recommended)

On Extended Tours...

- ☐ Long-sleeved cotton shirt (sun protection) and loose-fitting pants (warmth and insect protection for evenings)
- ☐ Personal toiletries, insect repellent, medication & torch
- ☐ Sleeping bag (Bring your own or we can provide for \$35 – request prior to tour. Can be kept after travel or donated to charity.)
